Living at Mornington Road

Mornington Road comfortably houses six people in single occupancy bedrooms, all with vanity units and built in wardrobes.

Two of these bedrooms are on the ground floor and are suitable for people with a physical disability.

This home is wheelchair accessible on the ground floor and features a ground floor toilet and shower room, and two additional bathrooms on the first floor: one with shower and toilet, the second with bath and toilet.

Mornington Road also boasts an open plan kitchen and dining area and a comfortable lounge complete with

dividing doors to allow greater privacy for visits and activities.

Daily activities

A variety of in-house activities are available as well as accessing the local community library and social clubs.

Support will be offered based on individual needs.

Risk management, Mental Capacity Act assessments and best interest decision making underpin our approach to supporting individuals to live their life in a meaningful way.

Core support services

- 24 hour support including waking night staff, 7 days a week
- 1:1 support hours designed with each person as required.
- Individual person centred support plans, personal care and medication support where appropriate.
- Risk management through multi disciplinary approach.
- Support to access local community resources.
- Support to identify appropriate community services to meet individual needs.
- We recognise that everybody is unique and requires different levels of support. We are able to offer additional 1:1 hours if required.

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Eligibility

To be eligible to live at the service, people must be over 18 years old, have a learning disability and have an assessment carried out by the referring local authority.

Support Staff

- Experienced and established team of support staff.
- Trained in person-centred approaches and in safeguarding vulnerable adults.
- Additional training to ensure that all staff meet legislative requirements and the specific needs of the residents we support including supporting people with complex needs and autism.
- Input from a specialist manager around behaviours that challenge and autism.
